

The Community health nurses provide health services, education and resources.

The purpose of **Health Promotion** is to enable communities and their people to gain greater control over all the factors that affect their own health.

The Environmental Public Health Program provides disease prevention and education in your community. The Environmental Public Health Officer (EPHO) is knowledgeable about drinking water, food safety, substandard housing, wastewater, solid waste disposal, communicable disease control/surveillance and emergency preparedness.

Wellness

The Wellness program strives to provide wholistic and culturally appropriate mental health, addictions services and support communities in building capacity for wellness.

Our programs include:

The Counselling Program provides mental health and addictions counselling with adults 18 years and up. Youth counselling with youth 10-17 years of age from BRT6HC communities.

The Matrix Intensive Addictions Outpatient Program is a structured treatment where clients receive information and support in building a substance-free lifestyle.

The **Cultural Team** provides services to Residential school survivors and clients who request elders or cultural support.

The Community Outreach Program provides outreach to the communities on mental health and addictions education, tobacco prevention programming and other community based support to assist communities to maximize their knowledge in mental health and wellness.

Healthy Families Program

The **Head Start Program** is designed to provide the following components: Culture & Language, Education, Health Promotion, Nutrition, Social Support and Parental Involvement. It is for children ages 0-6 years of age.

The School Dental & COHI Program provides a full range of dental treatment and services for children ages 0-18 years of age enrolled in our First Nations schools as well as Community Oral Health Initiative (COHI) provided to children 0-6 years of age & education services provided by our COHI/Dental Aide.

The Early Childhood Outreach Worker provides support to families who are navigating through the health care system by connecting them to resources & services. For ages 0 to 18 years old.

The Jordans Principle Service Coordinator is a Child first initiative that provides supports to families on and off First Nations communities. This program ensures there are no gaps in publicly funded, health, social, and educational programs. The Jordan's Principle Service Coordinator supports families with children 0-18 years of age.

The Family Health Workers provide services to the Prenatal & Postnatal mothers. Some of the services that they provide: prenatal classes, healthy choices, moss bag making project, nursing cover project, voucher program, support well baby clinic, hospital tour, grocery tour, table talks, positive parenting classes and they provide transportation to the clinic to access services.

Family Health workers, Community Daycares, Head Start Home visitors, Early Childhood Outreach Worker, Jordan's Principle service coordinator, Dental Therapist, Dental Assistant, Head Start Support Worker, Cultural Facilitator, COHI/Dental Aide
